- First 2 weeks of next term; will be no tuckshop for the first Tuesday, maybe just volunteer on Thursday. Alternative idea put the prices up/charge a fee on school fees so that we can employ another full time person. Mark raised the idea that idea of grade 11/12 using the kitchen for hospitality to help with the running of the tuckshop. Also, maybe casual school officers doing time sheeted days in the tuckshop.
